**Were you activated into active duty as a member of the National Guard or as a Reservist?-NEW QUESTION (survey only)**

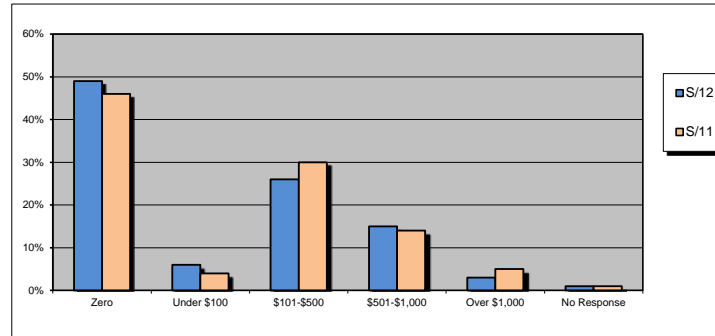

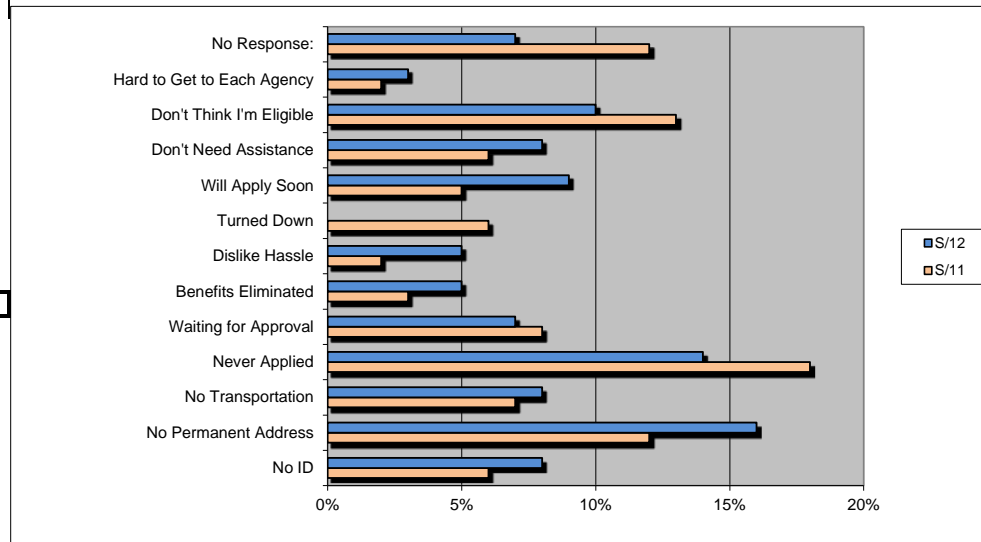

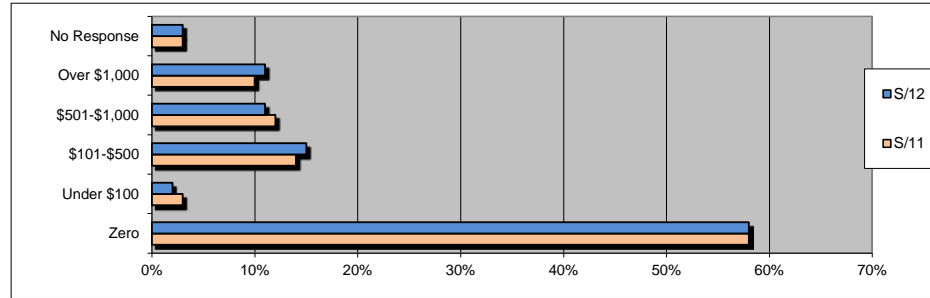

**How much monthly income do you receive (survey only)**

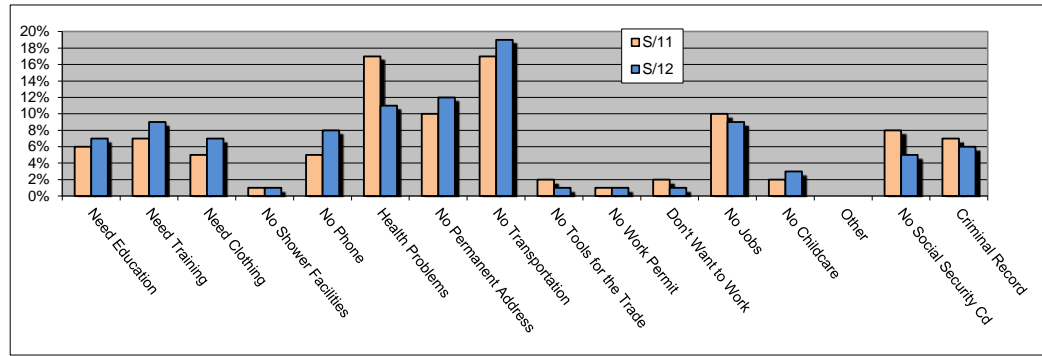

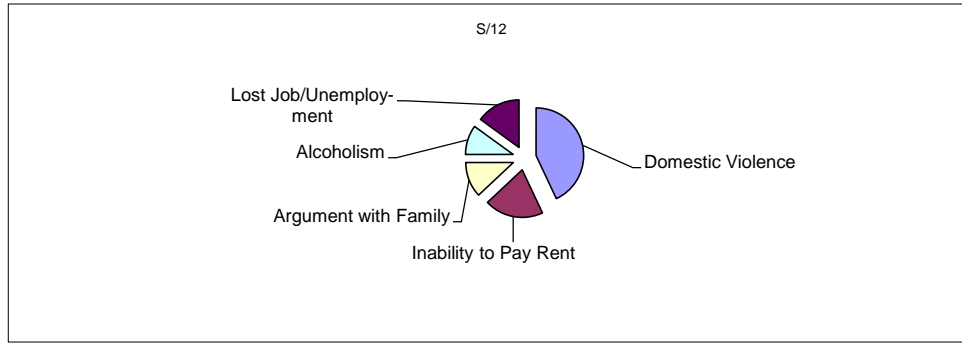

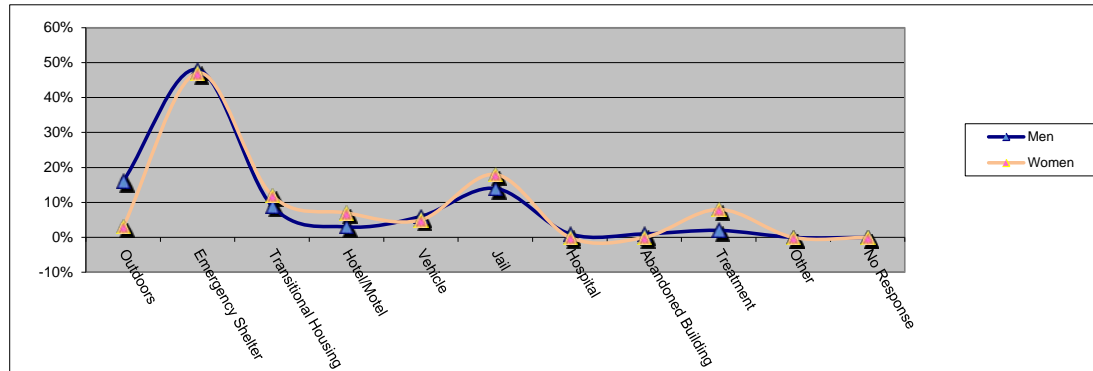

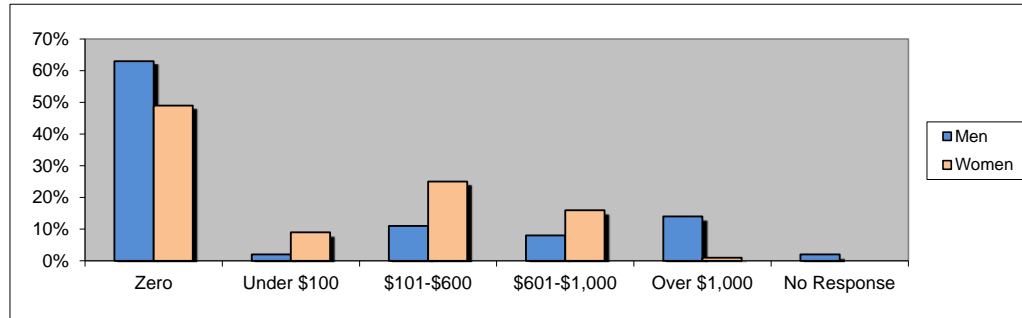
